CALL TO ORDER AND PRAYER

Chairman Johnson welcomed everyone and Council Member Wm. Rhett Butler opened the meeting with prayer.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Chairman Johnson advised that there was a need to amend the agenda to place Agenda Item 19 Budget Workshop before Agenda Item 18a Executive Session. There was also a need for Council to enter into Executive Session pursuant to S.C. a. March 3, 2021 - Regular Meeting

a. Finance Committee - Committee Chair Butler

The Finance Committee approved the purchase of one truck for the Sheriff's Department to be purchased at that time in accordance with the Procurement Policy. It is now the recommendation of the Finance Committee that Council approve the purchase of a second truck for the Sheriff's Department.

Council Member Butler made a motion to approve the purchase of one truck by the

Sheriff's Department. Vice-Chair Curtis seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.

ITEMS SUBMITTED BY STAFF

a. Inmate Food Services Bid Award - Stanley

Ms. Stanley advised that the three bids were received for inmate food services (see attached Bid Tabulation). It is the recommendation of the Sheriff James Dixon that the bid be awarded to Skillet Kitchen, which is actually lower than the current food service contract.

Council Member Conklin made a motion to award the bid to Skillet Kitchen. Council Member Watson seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.
