#### **STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### a. Finance Committee - Committee Chair Burns

#### i. Ambulance Franchise Renewal

Committee Chair Burns advised the Finance Committee met on April 17, 2023, at which time staff advised they had received an Ambulance Franchise Renewal request from Heartline Transport Services. Staff has reviewed the documentation for this request and found everything to be in order. It is the recommendation of the Finance Committee that Council approve this Franchise Renewal.

Council Member Burns made a motion to approve the Ambulance Franchise Renewal from Heartline Transport Services. Council Member Smallwood seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.

#### ii. Purchase of Gurney (Coroner's Office)

Committee Chair Burns advised that at the April 17, 2023, there was discussion regarding a request from the Coroner for the County to purchase a gurney for his department at a cost of \$4,000 from ARPA funds. It is the recommendation of the Finance Committee that Council allow the Coroner to purchase a gurney using ARPA funds.

Council Member Conklin made a motion to approve the purchase of a gurney for the Coroner's Office at a cost of \$4,000 from ARPA funds. Council Member Curtis seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.

#### iii. Purchase of Backhoe (Public Works) - Stanley

Ms. Stanley advised that the Finance Committee discussed the purchase of a backhoe for Public Works at the April 17, 2023 Finance Committee meeting. It is the recommendation of the Finance Committee that Council allow Public Works to purchase a backhoe using Tribal funds and that the old backhoe be sold.

Council Member Miller made a motion to approve the purchase of a backhoe for Public Works using Tribal funds and approval for the old backhoe to be sold. Council Member Conklin seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.

#### b. Ambulance, Fire and Rescue Committee - Committee Chair Curtis

### i. Request for Proposals – County Emergency Medical and Ambulance Services (ID NO. 03-22/23)

Committee Chair Curtis advised that the Ambulance, Fire and Rescue Committee met on April 26, 2023 and reviewed submission in response to Request for Proposals for County Emergency Medical and Ambulance Services, and conducted interviews with AmeriPro EMS and Lifeguard Emergency Medical Services. It was determined by unanimous vote of the Committee that Lifeguard Emergency Medical Services was the most qualified proposer and it was, therefore, the recommendation of the Committee that Council authorize negotiation of a contract with that entity.

Council Member Curtis made a motion to authorize negotiation of a contract with Lifeguard Emergency Medical Services. Council Member Conklin seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.

#### ITEMS SUBMITTED BY STAFF

#### a. Central Place Lane Bid Award - Stanley

Ms. Stanley advised that an Invitation for Bids (IFB) for C-Fund Roadway improvements to Central Place Lane was issued. Staff received a bid from Furr Grading and Paving in the amount of \$299,291.25, which was the only bid received.

It was staff's recommendation that Council accept and approve the base bid of Furr Grading and Paving in the amount of \$299,291.25.
