CALL TO ORDER AND PRAYER

Chairman Johnson welcomed everyone and Council Member Rhett Butler opened the meeting with prayer.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

<u>Chairman Johnson</u>: Advised that there was a need to amend the agenda to add Agenda Item 4b, COVID-19 Resolution and add Agenda Item 6b, personnel.

Council Member Watson made a motion to adopt the July 22, 2020 special meeting agenda with amendment and upon finding that exigent circumstances exist. Council Member Anderson seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.

ORDINANCE READINGS AND RESOLUTIONS

a. <u>Sunday Alcohol Sales Referendum Ordinance – 2nd Reading</u>

Council Member Watson made a motion to pass 2nd Reading. Vice-Chair Curtis seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.

b. COVID19 - Resolution

Council Member Butler made a motion to adopt the Resolution. Council Member Burns seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.

ITEMS SUBMITTED BY STAFF

a. Surplus Property (Sheriff's Department) - Stanley

Ms. Stanley advised that the Sheriff's Department has requested that Council declare a 2009 Dodge Charger, VIN #2B3KA43T49H638989 as surplus property so that it may be removed from inventory and sold pursuant to the County Procurement Policy.

Vice-Chair Curtis made a motion to declare the 2009 Dodge Charger, VIN #2B3KA43T49H638989 as Surplus property and authorize the sale of the same pursuant to the County Procurement Policy. Council Member Burns seconded the motion. Voting in favor of the motion was unanimous. Motion passed.
